About this e-discussion

Despite various national and EU level gender equality policies in science, the research sector in Europe continues to waste and underutilise highly skilled and talented women: Whilst in 2012 47% of all PhD graduates in the EU 28 are women they only make up a third of researchers in all sectors.

As described in the GenPORT Policy Briefs, the gap between countries that have a pro-active approach on gender equality in science and those that do not is widening. In addition, there is a lack of awareness about the importance of providing incentives for the recruitment and promotion of women researchers as part of a wider push for institutional change.

This e-discussion aims to provide recent insights concerning the design of effective recruitment and promotion measures for women in science.
